Sample Question

Given the state of the existing law of manslaughter the failure of some prosecutions was inevitable. To secure a conviction, the prosecution must currently identify an individual in the defendant organization who is the "controlling mind" of that organisation and whose actions were grossly negligent. The impossibility of identifying such a person has led to the collapse of every corporate manslaughter trial of a large organisation in legal history - at vast public expense. In one case alone, the total cost of the prosecution was thought to be over £8.5 million. NCR NCRAfter year's of consultation, the government finally unveiled its solution in march, although the bill applies only to england and wales, the scottish Executive are considerin similar re-form.
